# A Murder Is Announced

by Agatha Christie adapted by Leslie Darbon 24th January -2nd February 2019

I first came across this play when it was performed at Medway Little Theatre – probably more than twenty years ago, although being a Christie fan I was already familiar with the novel. Having enjoyed directing *And Then There Were None* I thought that it was time that Miss Marple had another airing.

The play was adapted from the novel by Leslie Darbon and first presented in 1977, a year after the death of Dame Agatha Christie. The time setting of the play is not well defined in the text, so I decided to set it in 1949, as the novel was first published in 1950.

Avid Christie fans who are familiar with the novel may notice that some of the characters in the book are not present in the play and I am grateful for this, as it has been a challenge to fit all the cast on our stage at times. I don't think that the story suffers from this editing and I hope that you can enjoy this adaptation of the novel as a piece of theatre in its own right. I believe that it remains truer to the original than some of the adaptations of Christie novels that we've seen on our TV screens in recent years.

I wanted to be able to tell you something about the writer Leslie Darbon but I have not been able to unearth much information without contacting the man himself or his agent. He appears to have been a jobbing writer who has written mainly for television. His TV credits include some episodes from Department S and the follow-up series Jason King, Shoestring, Bergerac and Crossroads amongst others. He collaborated with Richard Harris to write Two And Two Make Sex and Who Goes Bare?, with Peter Whelan to write Double Edge and A Cold Wind Blowing Up and with Paul Finney to write Correspondents' Course. His most recent play is Time To Kill, in 2006. He has also adapted the novel Cards On The Table for the stage but A Murder Is Announced would seem to be his most popular work. I hope that our production will do it justice.

Jez tries the floor for size. The set will develop and change throughout those on stage rehearsals, so Noel Coward's advice to actors to 'just say the lines and don't trip over the furniture' is actually pretty sound advice and might have been based on experience.
