The Beauty Queen of Leenane by Martin McDonagh

Medway Little Theatre, 4th-13th October 2018

The play is set in a rural cottage in Leenane, a small town in Connemara, County Galway, Western Ireland. The year: 1996.

Martin McDonagh was born in 1970 in Elephant and Castle. He has Irish parents and spent his summer holidays as a child in Connemara, the area depicted in this play. He left school at 16 and wrote 22 radio plays, all of which were rejected by the BBC.

He sent the script of *The Beauty Queen of Leenane* to Druid Theatre, an Irish touring company, which premiered the play at the Town Hall Theatre in Galway in 1996. As well as touring Ireland, it was seen at the Royal Court Upstairs and in the West End, winning several awards. In 1998, it tranferred to off-Broadway and then to Broadway, winning four Tony awards.

McDonagh's other plays include *The Cripple of Inishmaan* (National Theatre, 1997), *The Lieutenant of Inishmore* (RSC, 2002), *The Pillowman* (National Theatre, 2003) and *Hangmen* (Royal Court, 2015). His new play *A Very Very Dark Matter*, about Hans Christian Andersen, opens at the Bridge Theatre, London this month.

In 2006, his first film *Six Shooter* won an Oscar for Best Short Film. His first full-length film *In Bruges* opened in 2009 and this year *Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri*, which he wrote, directed and produced, won five BAFTA awards, including Best Film, and two Oscars.

Barry Kearns (Pato Dooley) has appeared in many productions over the last 15 years, including *Dirk Gently's Holistic Detective Agency, Look Back in Anger* as Jimmy Porter, *What the Butler Saw, Philadelphia, Here I Come!*, *Mother Courage, She Stoops to Conquer, Entertaining Mr Sloane* and *Of Mice and Men*. He directed *The Diary of Anne Frank*.

Jordan Lee (Ray Dooley) has a BA in Drama, Theatre and Performance Studies. He has appeared with several local theatre groups. Plays include *The Tempest, The Vicar of Dibley* and *Much Ado About Nothing*. This is his first appearance at MLT.

Melody Perrin (Maureen Folan) trained at the Miskin Theatre and De Montfort University, where she worked with a number of theatre professionals. She was invited to attend the National Student Drama Festival and has performed at the Edinburgh Festival. She played Alison Porter in our production last year of *Look Back in Anger*. Earlier she was in *My Boy Jack* and *Hobson's Choice*.

Linda Russell (Mag Folan) has appeared here in *Mother Courage* in the title role, *Dancing at Lughnasa*, *Abigail's Party, Entertaining Mr Sloane*, *Steel Magnolias* and *Bold Girls*. She directed *A Midsummer Night's Dream* and *My Mother Said I Never Should*. Returning to MLT after a year's break she is putting her life and soul into *The Beauty Queen of Leenane*.
